This year's proposed Executive Budget for FY2016-2017 included **\$91.6** Million in Library Aid. This amount represents a **4% decrease** over the final Library Aid amounts included in the FY2016-17 enacted budget and is **11% less** than what is required by Education Law [\$102.6 Million]. Our main focus asked for Library Aid to be funded to

Our Advocates spoke eloquently about how libraries continue to creatively adapt to meet the needs of their communities. This year we had a strong group of volunteers from WLS's <u>HSE Connect!</u> program [that assists those seeking to complete their high school equivalency diploma] and the <u>Westchester Seniors Out Speaking (WSOS)</u> program [that helps adults age 6 and older achieve a better understanding of the benefits provided by Medicare and other related services]. These innovative outreach programs are excellent examples of the evolving role of libraries to partner with governmental and other agencies to better engage, inform and empower their communities.

The proposed Executive Budget also includes \$14 Million for the Library Construction Aid Program. This represents a 26% decrease from the \$19 Million included with the enacted 2016-17 budget. Since this program was initiated back in 2006, over \$6 Million was awarded toward submitted project costs of over \$30 Million.
