The County Budget

The 2011 Proposed County Budget has been released. For full details, see:

The proposed allocation for Westchester Library System (WLS) is \$1 Million; and a summary of the general approval process for the County Budget follows:

- County Executive releases proposed version of the budget.
- Proposed budget is submitted to the Board of Legislators for review and approval
- Board of Legislators' Committee of Budget and Appropriations (B&A) is the lead Committee for review of the Executive's submission
- B&A Committee meets daily to review each department's request
- To insure public input, the Board of Legislators schedules Budget Hearings; this year's have been scheduled as follows:

- Board of Legislators must adopt the budget for the coming year no later than December 27th
- County Executive has veto power over increases made by the Board; a two-thirds vote of all members of the Board is required to override the County Executive's veto.

Westchester Library System – 2010 County TALKING POINTS

Efficiency – Consolidation of Services

Cataloging Service:

- ⇒ This centralized processing of materials saves our member libraries over 80% versus individual processing
- ⇒ Interlibrary Loan (ILL) upgraded to an online system in 2010 This will enable library users to place ILL requests directly, saving library staff time and creating a more efficient transaction.

Delivery Service:

- ⇒ More than 2.5 million items were delivered in 2009 to member libraries on behalf of their users.
- ⇒ The cost per delivery transaction is approximately **18**¢, almost a third the price of a U.S. postage stamp this service is very cost effective.
- ⇒ Distribution of informational brochures and other materials from Westchester County departments and agencies helps save thousands of dollars.

Preparation of the County's Work Force

- ⇒ 624 computers for public use and an extensive wireless network available for laptop users—providing the only source of free Internet access countywide
- ⇒ Learning Ambassadors Project: 7 Libraries participated in this innovative program to support the work experience needs of underserved youth in Westchester. 8 Learning Ambassadors successfully completed a week of intensive pre-service training, attended a workshop on financial literacy relevant to first work and pay experiences, and were gainfully employed at the participating libraries over the summer.
- ⇒ Conducted Job Search Skills Training covering topics such as resumes, job applications, interviews, and job search techniques
- ⇒ Developed a Teen Job Finder Guide to assist youth with finding employment
