Sixth Annual Westchester Library System Battle of the Books 21 Westchester Public Libraries competed in book trivia competition for 4th – 10th graders October 19th, 2019 Hommocks Middle School Larchmont, NY

The sixth annual Westchester Library System Battle of the Books took place on **Saturday, October 19th, 2019 at Hommocks Middle School in Larchmont, NY, part of the Mamaroneck UFSD.** Two champions were crowned: Briarcliff Manor Public Library, in the Grades 4-6 tournament, and Town of Pelham Public Library in the Grades 6-10 tournament. Over 300 young people representing 21 libraries participated in this event. The Westchester Library System's (WLS) Battle of the Books is a fast-paced trivia competition for avid readers entering Grades 4-10. There were two separate competitions on the same day: a Children's (Grades 4-6) and a Teens (Grades 6-10) Tournament, each with 17 teams.
