Westchester Library System Attacked By Ransomware Virus

A ransomware virus attack on the Westchester Library System is being investigated, an IT official said on Wednesday, July 10.

Public access PCs were turned off temporarily as a precaution and restored to service on Friday, July 5 and Saturday, July 6.

In a public statement to library system patrons, WLS announced that the "virus disabled servers that control services used by PCs such as network management, printing and authentication."

"The server that contains patron data, the circulation system and online catalog was not impacted by this event and no data breach is suspected," the announcement said. "Public WiFi and online resources were also unaffected."

Harckham, Abinanti Secure \$400K Funding for Mt. Pleasant Library

Children's Room Will Be Renovated and Modernized at the Pleasantville Branch

Demonstrating their strong support for public libraries, Senator Pete Harckham, 40th Senate District, and Assemblymember Tom Abinanti, Assembly District 92, announced a combined total of nearly \$400,000 in funding to modernize and renovate the Children's Room in the Mount

Pleasant Public Library in Pleasantville.

"My commitment to our public libraries is strong," **said Senator Pete Harckham.** Today, I'm thrilled to announce that over \$140,000 in SED library construction funding is going to the Mount Pleasant Public Library, a thriving community gathering place for our children, families, students and seniors. My colleague, Assemblymember Tom Abinanti, has secured a \$250,000 State Aid to Municipalities grant for the same construction project at the library. These combined funds of nearly \$400,000, will be used to modernize and improve the Children's Room. In total, this year, the libraries in my district are receiving nearly \$500,000 in awards and aid through the NYS Senate - including nearly \$240,000 in SED library construction awards and a total of \$250,000 in bullet aid funding (\$13,889 for each SD40 library) that I secured for miscellaneous improvements."

Assemblymember Tom Abinanti said, "Libraries are an education center, a research center and a community center. Getting State grants to our local libraries is among the best way to lower property taxes and bring State taxes back home."

The funds awarded to the Mt. Pleasant Public Library will be used for various improvements including new LED lighting, furnishings, a new ceiling and the reconfiguration of the room for more modern uses. The library, which is a joint municipal library for the Town of Mt. Pleasant and the Village of Pleasantville, is currently surveying the community on how to use the money to further upgrade the Children's Room. The library has an active children's program including story times for infants, toddlers and preschoolers, family story times, evening "pajama" story times and musical concerts for children.

Mayor Peter Scherer, Pleasantville, said, "We're delighted that Senator Harckham and Assemblymember Abinanti have secured this new funding for our library. This long-standing model of shared services between the Village of Pleasantville and the Town of Mount Pleasant is an anchor for our community, and we deeply appreciate the support of the Senator and Assemblymember."

Carl Fugenzi, Town Supervisor, Town of Mt. Pleasant said, "The Town of Mount Pleasant appreciates the efforts of Senator Harckham and Assemblyman Abinanti in securing the funding for the essential improvements to the Mount Pleasant Public Library. All in our community, especially our children, will benefit from the upgrades made to the Children's room. We look forward to seeing this project come to fruition."

John Fearon, Library Director, Mount Pleasant Public Library, said, "The Mount Pleasant Public Library is fortunate to be jointly funded by two municipalities, the Town of Mount Pleasant and the Village of Pleasantville, that are committed to supporting top class library services. Their strong support of the Library has enabled us to grow, and to be able to successfully respond to new challenge and new demands.

However, each municipality is highly sensitive to the pressures on local tax payers. To that end, the support that the Library has received from its elected representatives at the New York State level is invaluable. The grants that have been received from New York State have supported a number of important infrastructure projects, such as a roof replacement and the upgrading the Library's HVAC system.

These latest grants continue that tradition. The Library is currently running a community-based planning process for children's services. That process will result in recommendations for improvements to the Children's Room. These grants will allow the Library Board to commit to realizing those recommendations. As a result, thousands of children across the Library's community will benefit."



White Plains Library receives \$140K construction grant for renovations

A grant worth \$140,591 was awarded to the White Plains Public Library today to renovate the second floor's public meeting rooms and museum gallery.

The New York State Library Construction Grant will be used for public meeting rooms, which are used as classrooms, library programs and spaces for community organizations to hold meetings.

The Library's Museum Gallery provides a space to view public art created by established and emerging artists.

Due to renovations, the auditorium, two public meeting rooms, and the Museum Gallery will be unavailable for use through March 2020,

White Plains Public Library awarded construction grant

In 2017, a \$153,807 grant prompted renovations of the community room, classrooms and cafe. In 2014, a \$67,400 grant allowed for the creation of a learning commons area for adults.

More funds allocated to library renovations allows for greater outreach within the community. With assistance from state delegation members, the funding for this particular construction grant was received.

"It's important to continue providing construction funds for our libraries in their emerging role as community centers," Assemblyman David Buchwald said.

Harrison Library Play2Learn Soars for 2019

The Harrison Public Library presents over 1,900 programs annually, but none have an impact like the Play2Learn Festival, which drew over 3,000 kids and parents last year.

September 7 marks another encore for the Play2Learn Festival, the award-winning Harrison Public Library celebration of childhood learning through play that has wowed kids and parents for the past three years. This year's edition promises to take the event to new heights—literally.

"Our new activities for 2019 will dazzle the kids," according to Play2Learn chair Fran Brescia-Coniglio. "The not-so-young folks will have plenty of fun, too!"

The Play2Learn Festival will be held Saturday, September 7, 11 AM to 2 PM at Riis Park in front of the Halperin Memorial Library in downtown Harrison.

New activities will take kids from the sea to the sky this year. Drones operated by Aviated Precision will not only provide video of the event but enable kids to take "dronies" from the sky from their asteroid booth.

The Play2Learn Festival will also feature a slate of new activities from the Whaling Museum & Education Center. Thanks to a grant from the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, kids will learn how they can help restore and protect the health and living resources of Long Island Sound.

"These new activities exemplify what the Play2Learn Festival is all about," says HPL Director Galina Chernykh. "Children learn by playing just like they do in classrooms. Our goal is to show them many ways to learn while they're having fun."

Other popular activities set to return this year include the Bubble Bus, the Cooking Crew, and Fenom Fitness. More than 40 activities will be offered in eight play zones themed for physical, music, creative, science, make believe, technology, construction, and sensory activities at the Festival. Kids who play in at least five of the eight zones will win a prize. The festival will also feature music, food, and a variety of entertainment.

To keep the Play2Learn Festival free to the public, it is entirely funded by the Harrison Public Library Foundation through sponsor donations, grants, and individual gifts. At press time,

Fidelity Investments, Smile Starters Pediatric Dentistry, White Plains Hospital, and Moving Harrison Forward are lead sponsors.

In addition, ArtsWestchester awarded the Play2Learn Festival a 2019 Arts Alive Grant, an award made possible with funds from the Decentralization Program (DEC), a regrant program of the New York State Council on the Arts with the support of Governor Andrew Cuomo and the NYS Legislature and administered by ArtsWestchester.

"While we always can use financial support, we also need a host of volunteers," says HPLF President Dave Donelson. "We need people to help at the activity zones, to pass out activity maps, to greet and direct the families, and to set up and tear down the facilities." 

Each library will receive \$13,889



The Library Media Box™ manufactured by Publ Information Kiosk, a Division of International Librar Services of Potomac Maryland, is a Kiosk that will hold ar

dispense 750 of the latest DVD's and music CD's. The complete collection will be visible on the Kiosk Monitor the Library Main Lobby on South First Avenue and will be on the library's website where patrons can browse an reserve DVD's or music CD's in their home and conveniently pickup reservations and make returns the kiosk.

The Library Media Box™ was purchased with funds for library construction and construction related service provided by DASNY (Dormitory Authority of the State of New York) as a part of its Community Reconstructic Program. "This technology will minimize the amount of time our staff spends cataloguing and retrieving our growing inventory and will make borrowing easier for our patrons said Trustee Davis. "It's like renting a movie from the supermarket by using your library card instead of a crecitary."

The Mount Vernon Public Library was built in 1905 wifunds donated by Andrew Carnegie, it is the only remainir library in Westchester County operating in the footprint the original building. It is a member of the Westcheste Library System and the Central Library for Westcheste County New York, heralding the largest collection in Westchester County and the sixth largest collection in the State of New York. The Library now houses more tha 350,000 items including books, periodicals, streamir media, CDs, DVDs, movies, electronic content eBook eMagazines, digital audio books, online databases an more, as well as providing public-use computers, museum passes, literacy programs and special events and activitie
