WESTCHESTER LIBRARY SYSTEM Trustee Meeting June 23, 2016 – Approved September 27, 2016

REGULAR MEETING

The Regular Meeting of the Westchester Library System was called to order by Cathy Draper, President, at 6:05 p.m. at WLS Headquarters. The quorum requirement was met with the following people in attendance:

MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting of May 31, 2016, were accepted as submitted on a motion by Ms. Neale and seconded by Mr. Ryan. The motion passed unanimously [Dr. Jacknis not present for vote].

ACTION ITEMS

Revised IT Finance Model: Mr. Caluori gave an overview of the IT Finance Model created in conjunction with the PLDA Finance Committee. Members of the PLDA Finance Committee, Ms. Davis and Ms. Bermel, spoke about the process taken to develop the new model and its pros and cons. The revised model is based on the programs and services provided by WLS and their actual costs and was approved by the PLDA membership (27:3 vote) at their June meeting. The new model would be implemented in January 2017. One concern was whether the libraries who would incur an increase from the proposed model would be able to justify it. The fees are part of being in a consortium, and the new model's method of calculating the fees will allow for invoices that are easier to understand and to explain to funding sources. It also incorporates some flexibility for the libraries to modify their costs should they need it.

The Board approved the proposed IT Finance Model as submitted (see attached) on a motion by Ms. Furth and seconded by Ms. Amato. The motion passed with 8 votes for and two votes against [Mr. Donelson; Mr. Ryan]. The board recognized the PLDA Finance Committee for their hard work and their inclusive exercises in formulating the new model.

FINANCIAL REPORTS

The financial reports for May 2016 were presented by Ms. Scherer and were accepted as submitted on a motion by Mr. Donelson and seconded by Mr. Vander Linden. The motion passed

unanimously. Ms. Feuerman distributed the WLS Check Register; and Ms. Draper asked a question regarding auditing claims. The most recent audit completed by the NYS Comptroller's Office did not mention any issue with WLS's procedures; but WLS staff will explore the issue further.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As a firm believer of trustee development, Ms. Draper has identified a few topics of interest for further review and discussion at future board meetings. One was post-retirement health benefits and the other was Dr. Kirchner's presentation on board and director evaluations that he gave at the Library Trustees Association of New York State (LTA) Trustee Institute. The Strategic Working Group, which is made up of half the board members, met on June 14; and notes from that meeting were shared. Half of the meeting discussed SWOT (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, threats). This group is not meant to write the required Plan of Service but to help WLS grow as an organization. Various background documents were shared with the Committee; and Ms. Draper will forward them to all board members for their information.

Ms. Draper noted that there was a change to the New York State Open Meetings Law regarding committee meetings. Even if less than a quorum makes up the committee, those meetings are also subject to Open Meetings Law. Trustees were encouraged to make sure that proper notice is given, minutes are taken, and materials are made available for committee meetings. FOIL was also discussed, and trustees were reminded to use their WLS email accounts for WLS board business and not their personal accounts.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

A copy of the Executive Director's Report was mailed in advance of the meeting.

Dr. Kirchner, as President of the Public Library System Directors Organization (PULISDO), met with newly appointed State Education Commissioner Maryellen Elia along with two other PULISDO members, NYS Librarian Bernie Margolis and Carol Desch, Coordinator for Statewide Library Services for Division of Library Development (DLD). Topics discussed covered access to the State Education Department (SED) for regional libraries; an active partnership to serve K-12; adult continuing education at the statewide level; and better channeling of resources.

NYS Regents Advisory Council is seeking new members. If interested, contact DLD by August 1st.

New York State Public Library Construction Aid for FY2015-16 is close to being released. Local legislators will notify libraries of their awards; and the next round will be starting shortly.

Prior to the board meeting, the 570 Taxter location was available for a tour. The move is expected to take place on June 28, 29 & 30. Telephone numbers and email addresses will remain the same. The budget is within the approved guideline. The staff was thanked for their help with the move; and the WLS Trustee ID Badges from 540 were handed in.

PLDA LIAISON'S REPORT

Mr. Kenney reported that most of the work for PLDA focused around the Finance Model previously discussed.

ADJOURNMENT

Having completed its agenda, the Board adjourned its meeting at 7:25 p.m. on a motion by Ms. Neale, seconded by Dr. Jacknis, which passed unanimously.
